#### When did you start playing guitar?

Started playing guitar at age 11 (1976) after two years of violin instruction at Syracuse City Schools. My uncle, Ed Hamell, was my first instructor — followed by Chuck Cavallero (Guitar Studio in Eastwood), then later Rick Ballestra, and Gordon Moore.



#### What was your motivation to learn the instrument?

Major motivation was to play music that I was hearing on the radio — and that guitar was a very "cool" instrument.

### What style(s) do you play?

In the past 14 years, I've moved toward playing a lot of flatpicking style, — a la Doc Watson, Tony Rice, Norman Blake. In years past, I've studied classical style, fingerstyle and jazz.

#### What make/model guitar(s) do you play?

My newest favorite is a Bourgeois Country Boy, Mahogany w/Sitka Spruce top. I have a Martin 000 with cutaway, a 1970 D-18, a Matsuako classical, and a Bill Lawrence Swampkaster telecaster.

### What kind of strings do you like?

I generally use D'Addario 80/20 bronze 12-56s. Sometimes will splurge on coated strings

## Do you play out?

## What is your practice routine?

Generally, I'll have a tune or two that I'm learning and will be working on them. I'll do regular exercises for cross picking techniques, work on various triad voicings, etc. It's pretty loose, and I should be more disciplined for sure.

Always to grow and be a better player, better listener, better improviser — and just a better overall musician. I haven't been able to attend GL meetings for a while due to a Monday regular commitment, but GL is a great place to meet people, exchange ideas, learn different styles and just give me a boost.
